All of Jesus' miracles can be read in many different ways: there is always a message – almost a parable – behind each one, that tells us something about God, about his care for his people, about Jesus and about the promises God has made to us, his children. Today is no exception: on the simplest level, we see Jesus offering the greatest gift he could give to Bartimaeus - the gift of sight. It shows us Jesus' love and care for those who suffer. But that alone is not the whole meaning of this story, as the first reading makes clear: there, through Jeremiah, God promises to gather his children into a new and perfect Kingdom, washing away the tears and restoring comfort. So Jesus appears as a fulfilment of this prophecy, as the One who brings this Kingdom into the world. But it doesn't end there: in our own age we still have the blind, and those who suffer: there are still

tears to be washed away - Jesus' work is begun, but not completed. God's promises extend to us as well. As followers of Jesus, we should imitate him in doing what we can to bring that comfort which is the Kingdom of God to all in need.

Christmas Draw (SJ): Tickets for this annual raffle will be on sale next weekend.



I am with You – Year C: Last year a number of you bought copies of *I am with You – Year B* which provided reflections on the Sunday readings particularly focussed for married couples. The new book, just published, does the same things for Year C of the Sunday cycle of readings which begins this Advent.



Archbishop Nichols has written about this book: "The visit of Pope Benedict XV1 to the United Kingdom awakened in many people the desire to strengthen their family life and enrich the quality of their relationships. This book will certainly help to satisfy that desire, not least because it is a valuable aid to prayer - so necessary if the

inevitable challenges and difficulties of everyday family life are to be faced. With the help of these pages I hope that husbands and wives will discover the source of courage required for acceptance, pardon and dialogue which characterize a true communion of hearts and minds. I commend this publication as a timely initiative, alongside the new translation of the Roman Missal, which will help to deepen Eucharistic love within marriages so as to constantly renew the core of the domestic church"
