5 February 2023 Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time



In the Gospels the language used is very simple, it is the language of the day, and when Jesus talks to us he uses everyday images to capture our attention. This week he speaks of Salt and Light; two images which mean as much to us today as they would to the listeners on the Mount all those years ago. Salt was important to the people who could not preserve food without the use of salt and light, which is essential for life, gave them the daylight by which they could work.

Isaiah urges the people to share what they have with the hungry, the homeless, the naked, and with each other for "then will your light shine like the dawn". He sees the light that shines from every person as having the potential to create a positive influence on the world. Today we see the church involved in many forms of interaction with the poor. From Food Banks to overseas aid the light from many volunteers and donors is shining brightly but when we look around, we see that even with this level of commitment the need is even greater.

Paul acknowledges that he makes no claim to oratory or philosophy, he is humble enough to realise that he is a vessel that is used to bring faith to those who seek the light. His message is simple, Christ cannot enter our lives through oratory or philosophy, only through the power of the spirit. It is the simple actions of care and compassion that we show our neighbours and strangers that the message of God's love will be spread.

Jesus calls us to be "the salt of the earth"; it is a phrase which seems to have fallen out of use in everyday language. The salt of the earth were the men and women who had the qualities so necessary in daily life, they were the unpaid helpers always ready to give a hand, the people everyone could call upon in time of trouble. This is what Jesus calls us to be, but we must take care that we do not become complacent and loose our taste. The light of the people of God must shine brightly; people are drawn to the church through your example. They do not seek knowledge: they seek the love of Christ that shines through you. *David Frank*
