The Second Sunday of Lent



Last week we encountered the Temptations in the wilderness as Jesus prepared Himself for His great missionary journey. Today that journey comes to a close, with a mountaintop vision of Christ shining like the sun, transfigured before the sight of Peter, James and John.

We each have a call from God, something He wants us to do. Many spend years unaware of this call and often fail to hear even when situations shout out to us to act. Our human nature is drawn towards the rewards of this world, and we do not always hear the cries of those less fortunate than ourselves. Lent is a time to open our ears, look around, and move towards His light which is always pointing to those who need our help. Lent is not about giving things up it is about taking up the call to act in love for our neighbour.

Abram heard the call; he charged round the desert and wild places of the middle east looking for the One who was calling to him. He found the land promised to him by God as a place for God's holy people. He was faithful, he believed in a God he could not see but he sensed His presence. We follow Abraham, we have faith in a God that we cannot see but something within calls us to faith.

Paul writes to Timothy; many years have passed since the death and resurrection of the Lord. Paul sees the hardships endured by the people of God and urges them not to give up. Jesus promised that the power of God would cloth them with a spirit of holiness. That His grace would sustain them through all that they must endure for His sake. That spirit of holiness, that grace of God, falls now upon our shoulders, we are Gods presence in our world and, if we ask Him, He will give us the strength to do His work in our world.

The Transfiguration was not an end, but a beginning. We encounter, now, a confident Jesus, prepared for all that may follow. He sets out for that final journey to Jerusalem, to His death and resurrection and, through the readings of Lent, He carries us with Him. *David Frank*
