Laetare Sunday – 4th Sunday of Lent



There is a line from today's Psalm which, I believe, will help us to understand the passages that we listen to today. "The Lord is my shepherd" is a very familiar psalm but the phrase I would ask you to consider is "He guides me along the right path; he is true to his name." In the Season of Lent we are asked to look at our lives and to try to change those parts which lead us away from our God of Love. We cannot do this alone; we need to want to change, we need the help of those around us, and we need the guiding hand of the Spirit, if we are to find our way.

We make decisions in a very human way; whatever we need in life we tend to choose that which will give us the satisfaction we need. If we feel threatened then we need strength, if we need company, we seek love and if we feel unwanted, we look for understanding. These are our ideals not God's. We seldom look at situations from God's point of view. Samuel was given the task of anointing a king: he was sent to the family of Jesse to select the one most suitable for the task ahead. Each one he chose was rejected by God; God does not choose by appearance or intelligence or strength, God looks at the character of the individual and so God chose David, the shepherd boy, the most unlikely of all the sons of Jesse.

The psalm continues "If I should walk in the valley of darkness, no evil would I fear." Paul writes to the Ephesians about the darkness of sin that we encounter in our world. He urges us to seek the Light of Christ which will lead us out of this darkness into "complete goodness, right living, and truth". He calls us to "wake from our sleep" so that the light of Christ will shine on us.

In this season of encounters today we meet a man who has been blind from birth. Jesus sees the man and, moved by compassion, he opens his eyes. This encounter changes everything. From a world of darkness, he comes to a world where every word he speaks is taken as a weapon to attack him. He loses his family, his neighbours turn against him, the religious authorities drive him away, all because he has received the precious gift of sight. Only Christ stands with him; to help him to enter a world of new opportunities and to offer him the gift of faith. This leads us into the final lines of the psalm "Surely goodness and kindness will follow me all the days of my life." *David Frank*
