15 October 2023 Twenty-Eighth Sunday Ordinary Time



Paul made a number of visits to the Church in Philippi, they were very supportive of him and helped him in his missionary work. Today we listen to the end of his letter to them. As he writes, he paints a picture of the children of God. They have lived with hardship but now they enjoy the benefits of their faithfulness to God. They have been hungry but now are fed, they were poor but now are rich for the love of God has been poured out on them. This is a vision of a people ready for the heavenly banquet that is waiting for them.

Today we have the third and final parable that Jesus uses to try and teach the leaders of the Jewish people that the love of God is for everyone who believes in Him. We begin with a passage from Isaiah and a description of a banquet that God prepares on His holy mountain. The reading is full of the promises of God; it is a vision of heaven where death is no more, and joy and happiness fill the banqueting hall. The celebration is for those who hoped in the Lord, those who stayed faithful to Him. The Jewish people have come through many hardships to reach the holy mountain, and this is their reward. However, they must prove themselves worthy of God's blessings.

The chief priest and elders were content to live in their palaces and lord it over the people. They cared for themselves only and treated the poor and the sinners with disdain. They refused to change their ways, the poor and the sinners came to the celebration in their place, but they too must understand that change is necessary if they are to enjoy the feast. The one who is thrown out of the feast is one who has not changed, he still wears the clothing of the sinner, he has not taken on the garment of salvation. The parable reminds us that in order for the love of God to enter our hearts we too must change and place the needs of others before ourselves, we must know what it means to be poor so that we are filled with the richness that comes from God.
