

The Seventh Sunday of Easter



As the joyous season of Easter draws to a close, this Sunday's Scripture brings our focus onto Christ's loving relationship with us. We see how the very early Church decided that the person who was to replace Judas needed to be someone who had known Jesus personally from the very start of his ministry, and had witnessed his suffering, death and resurrection. We can pray with great joy the Psalm of thanks for all the blessings of God's love - a love that is calling all of us into a deeper personal relationship. John's letter (Second Reading) is like a summary of the Good News and the mystery of the Resurrection. We are encouraged to love one another. It is through our loving relationships that we will come to know God more fully. God is love, and God shares the Spirit of love with us when we die to ourselves and give ourselves fully to love. In John's Gospel we hear Jesus praying to the Father for his followers. Jesus wants us to share fully in his joy. It is in this spirit of Easter joy that we are sent out into the world to draw all people into that relationship of love of which each and every one is invited to be a part. Let us pray for the grace to be able to live out the joy of the Gospel of love in every part of our life!

Bishop John blessed the statue of Our Lady and was so grateful for the fantastic turnout this year. He asked that we spread the word to others who may like to come in the future.

Walking the Rosary mile was quite incredible. Although we were really lucky with the weather, the tranquility and stillness allowed time for prayer and reflection and a chance to walk alongside other pilgrims not just from our own parish, but from across the diocese

For those who had never seen the Shrine before, it was quite simply a moment of instant peace as the whole place is filled with such spirituality. There was a service of Reconciliation in the chapel and we were lucky enough to have nine priests with us. Afterwards the Chapel was prepared for Mass, and the wide doors were opened up so that people could sit inside and out. Many of us took advantage of the weather and sat outside. How blessed we were to be able to come together for Mass in such a beautiful place! Although the journey home was tiring, and we didn't arrive back until 11pm, we all agreed it had definitely been a wonderful and memorable day.

If you are able to go next year, it is guaranteed you will get so much out of the day (even if it is long), although, we can't guarantee the same glorious weather!

## Parish Novena to the Holy Spirit

The Spirit of Piety that we may love you with true devotion.

The Spirit of Courage that we may witness to you come what may.

The Spirit of Knowledge that we may know you in friendship and love.

The Spirit of Understanding that our minds will be enlightened by truth.

The Spirit of Counsel that we may choose the right path to follow.

The Spirit of Awe and Wonder that we may be filled with loving reverence for you.

**Day 2 (Saturday 12 May).** Spirit of the Living God, grant us today the gift of *Piety* so that we may work together to make our parish ever more missionary

I am conscious that in recent years, with increased diocesan commitments, I have not been able to do as much as I would like to have done here - and particularly with our wonderful schools, the three parish primary schools and Thornleigh College. I am grateful for the support given by assistant priests: Fr Joe Gee, Fr Séan O'Brien and, of course, Fr Frank. Without their help, and the active involvement of so many of you, we could not have achieved so much over these years.

Thank you for your welcome and your support and thank you for your good wishes as I move to pastures new. God bless you all in the years ahead.
