HUMAN TRAFFICKING AND MODERN SLAVERY

Day for Life is celebrated yearly by the Catholic Church in Ireland, Scotland, England and Wales. It is a day dedicated to raising awareness about the meaning and value of human life at every stage and in every condition.

Jesus tells us, "I have come that you may have life, and have it to the full." (John 10:10 NJB). But many people do not have life to the full. They have fallen victim to the scourge of human trafficking and modern slavery which are an assault on a person's innate human dignity. People are not commodities to be traded ruthlessly for criminal profit. Indeed, this is something that is happening in communities across our country, not just in our big cities. It's not only happening in brothels and nail bars, but on farms, building sites and factories as well. Nor is this a problem confined to immigrant communities, it is affecting our own citizens too. Trafficking is a growing problem and the UN estimates that over 40 million people worldwide are in slavery. In the UK alone, it is estimated that every year there are over 13,000 victims of trafficking from all countries. Criminals exploit some of the most vulnerable and desperate people. We can act together to stop this. It is a crime hidden in plain sight, it's difficult to investigate, and the police need our help to identify and stop the traffickers and rescue and support the victims.

Caritas (Diocese of Salford) Anti-Trafficking, in partnership with the Santa Marta Group and the Medaille Trust, is seeking support from parishioners to raise awareness on human trafficking and modern-day slavery throughout the Diocese. Our awareness campaign aims to provide much needed intelligence to the Greater Manchester Police and Lancashire Police by alerting them to instances where something doesn't look right and may indicate an incidence of human trafficking.

The Medaille Trust (in partnership with Caritas) is the largest provider of safe house accommodation for victims of trafficking in the UK and has two safehouses in our diocese. The proceeds of the Day for Life collection to be held in parishes is used for the promotion of the dignity of the human person. Money collected for Day for Life will be used to fund projects that support work in this area by organisations which further this objective. Your donation is greatly appreciated.
