

Twenty-Eighth Week of Ordinary Time



In today's story of the rich young man, who comes to Jesus full of good intentions, there are some simple words that speak so clearly to our own age: when Jesus tells him to sell everything and give it to the poor, "his face fell at

these words, and he went away sad, for he was a man of great wealth." How sad it is that such a keen (he runs up to Jesus), and by all accounts good young man (whom Jesus loves) could not free himself from the one thing that was holding him back: his dependence on money. Jesus' words "How hard it is..." perhaps indicate his own sadness that the young man could not free himself from this. Jesus' teaching was new - as the disciples' reaction shows. In Israel at the time, riches were thought to be a blessing from God. But as Jesus knew and taught, holding on to anything that passes away can distract us from holding on to things that are eternal.

Marriage Matters

The call to change: No his or hers. Today, the Gospel calls us to share ALL that we have. We promised to do this on our wedding day when we said that we would change the things that come between us and develop the things that bring us together. It is this journey of change that makes our marriage the sign of Jesus' love for us all.

These days quite a few people present themselves as candidates for the priesthood and religious life after having worked in all sorts of different occupations. In undertaking such a change of life, they are prepared to give up property, good salaries and other comforts. May more people have the courage to make such sacrifices with confidence and trust in the Lord Jesus.

Prisoners' Sunday: Today is the National Day of Prayer and action for prisoners and their dependants as marked by the Catholic Church and across the Christian denominations. It is a day to direct our thoughts and prayers to prisoners, their families and children. Prisoners' Sunday is the time to reflect on how we as individuals, as a Church and as a community are serving those affected by imprisonment.

Prisoners' families, prisoners and people with previous convictions often find themselves on the margins of society due to the social stigma associated with imprisonment. They are often forgotten or come lower down on the list of causes to 'hold a hand out to'. But the gospel reminds us of our duties towards them, 'I was naked and you clothed me, sick and you visited me, in prison and you came to see me; (Matthew 25:36). Pact's work embodies the Christian value of mercy and belief in the innate dignity of every human being.

Our theme this year '*Go Beyond*', reflects on the impact we have when, as a community, we work to build a platform from which those confined to the margins of society can have their voices heard. As we '*go beyond*' in our dedication, our belief, our common love, we offer fresh hope to those affected by imprisonment. We hope that you will join us in Prayer today.

The second phase of Hope in the future was presented on Thursday 4 October at Salford Cathedral. Below is the covering letter from Bishop John Arnold.


4th October 2018 - Feast of St Francis of Assisi

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we come to the end of Stage 1 of our Diocesan programme Hope in the Future we have much for which to be thankful to God. The majority of our parishes now have an active team in place, each bringing their own creativity to the programme and working more closely with their schools. We have built firm foundations on prayer with the Formation Days on Mission and Evangelisation, the parish cycle of prayer and the parish teams retreat. We must now embark on the second stage of the programme and follow where we feel God is leading us as the Church in Salford. Stage 2 has two key focuses. The first is about Discerning our God-given Gifts, Talents and Charisms and then using them for the building up of our Parishes. The second is also about clergy and laity working closely together to share in the leadership of the Parish. In order to successfully do this, I believe we all need to recognise that the Spirit is already at work in our Diocese and Parishes and we need to deepen our listening. Personally, each of us needs to deepen our appreciation of our own Gifts, Talents and Charisms. Then we should collectively establish a shared leadership model right for our Parish made up of a range of people, each contributing their own God-given Gifts, Talents and Charisms. On behalf of the Hope in the Future working party I am pleased to share with you the next set of resources (Stage 2, Resources 1). The resources are also available electronically (www.dioceseofsalford.org.uk/parishes/resources). Further resources to help with setting up a Parish Shared Leadership Team will be distributed at the start of Lent 2019.
