#### New Translation of the Roman Missal Outline/Summary of Fourth Catechesis Session

Liturgy of the Eucharist

- The structure remains the same
- There are three elements
- Preparation of the Gifts (Offertory)
- Eucharistic Prayer
- Communion Rite

Preparation of the Gifts (Offertory)

- Hymn / Collection / Procession
- Some changes of wording (including quiet prayers)
- "through your goodness we have received the bread (the wine) we offer you"
- "my sacrifice and yours"
- "the good of all his holy Church"
- Prayer over the Offerings

#### Eucharistic Prayer

- Centre and summit of the entire Mass
- Opening Dialogue: "It is right and just" & Preface
- Holy Holy: "God of hosts"
- Choice of Eucharistic Prayers [more on them next week]
- "The Mystery of Faith"
- Doxology & Great Amen

#### Communion Rite

- The Lord's Prayer (unchanged)
- Sign of Peace
- Lamb of God
- Invitation to Communion
- Holy Communion
- Communion Hymn (or silence)
- Prayer after Communion
