Think Vocations

Thornleigh Goes From Strength to Strength

The report from the recent OfSTED inspection has now been received. It acknowledges the significant steps that have been taken since the last inspection (2008) and judges Thornleigh to be "a good and improving school whose Catholic ethos underpins its work as an inclusive and tolerant community in which all individuals are respected, nurtured and challenged to do their best."

This judgement reflects the inspection grades given under the various headings of the report. Pupil safety and care, guidance and support are judged to be outstanding (grade 1), whilst everything else is judged good (grade 2), with the exception of the Sixth Form provision which is satisfactory (grade 3) but with an acknowledgement in the text of the report that newly introduced systems in the Sixth Form have yet to have their full impact.

There has also been a Section 48 inspection this week (looking at Religious Education and the Catholic life of the school) and, whilst the written report is awaited, I can say that the inspector judged Thornleigh to be an outstanding Catholic school.

Congratulations must go to the headteacher, senior leadership team, the staff generally, and the governors* who have worked hard over the past few years to bring about these improvements after a difficult period.

Pupils too have played their part. The OfSTED report says: "They are proud of their school, feel extremely safe within it, behave well and enjoy the increasing range of opportunities they have to shape its ways of working."

Looking to the future, the report states that "The school's self-evaluation is accurate, objective and based on robust evidence. Leaders are clear about the school's priorities and how these are to be addressed. Their track record of securing improvement is strong and this, combined with a staff whose morale is high, supportive parents and carers, and clear management systems mean that there is good capacity to sustain improvement."

The three points for action within the report are about building on the good to outstanding practice that is already present in the school.

I hope that these independent judgements (and the significant improvements that they represent) will mean that all parents in these parishes will see Thornleigh as the natural first choice of secondary school for their children. It is a shining example of all that is best in Catholic education and we should preserve this for present and future generations.
