OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, UNIVERSAL KING



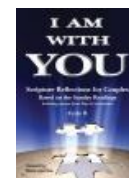
“Shepherd-King o’er mountain steep, homeward guide thy wand’ring sheep.” This hymn which we will probably sing today captures the readings perfectly: our King is not a cruel tyrant or despot, but a shepherd who loves his flock, who would (and did) give his life for them. Love for the flock means that he will have to judge them, separating the sheep from those who do not belong to him. Coming to the end of the Church’s year leads us to look to our final ending, the homecoming the hymn speaks of. The judgement of the end of time we do not view as a trial or a terror, but as a coming home: look back to the Isaiah reading on the 28th Sunday to see what a homecoming party is offered. All we do is put our lives in order, living just and holy lives, longing for the day of the lord to come.

St John's SVP Annual Report

The S.V.P. at St John's would like to thank Father Michael, friends and parishioners for their continued support, encouragement and generosity during the past year. Without this our work would not have been so effective in offering friendship and support to the sick, needy, housebound and lonely of our Parish.

Our S.V.P. has a thriving and active membership supported by a number of parishioners who help with transportation and other S.V.P. activities. Sadly in August of this year Joan Hyland, one of our longest serving members died very suddenly. Joan had served as our Secretary for over 20 years keeping us all in order with her unique wit and efficiency. She is greatly missed.

During the past twelve months the S.V.P. has undertaken the following activities within the Parish:

Visits: We have made 501 visits to people in their own homes, 9 visits to people living in residential homes and 2 hospital visits. In addition we have helped with transport for people who have difficulty in attending Mass and appointments to hospital and clinics.

Outings: Our visitees look forward to and enjoy these twice yearly events when we visit parishes of interest usually within the Salford Diocese. There is opportunity to learn a little of the history of the Parish, usually followed by Benediction and afternoon tea, a wonderful opportunity to catch up with old friends. This year we visited parishes in Langho and Clitheroe where we received their warm hospitality.

Sponsored Walk: St John's S.V.P. organises an annual sponsored walk for the Bolton District. The aim of this is to support the raising of funds to help needy families with financial support for holidays or other activities during school holidays.

Overseas Aid: This year we have made two donations to the baby feeding project in the Sudan.

Christmas Parcels: Each year we deliver food parcels to needy parishioners and from time to time are able to offer financial support.

We are constantly striving to find ways in which to reach parishioners who might benefit from our friendship and support. If anyone knows of someone who might benefit from this please contact any member of the S.V.P.

St Brendan's SVP Annual Report

We currently have 11 members, 10 of whom are active. We visit mainly on Tuesday evenings between 7.30pm and 8.30pm, plus some afternoon visiting if required.

In the year to 31st March 2011 we made 348 visits, including 272 to the elderly at home, 24 visits to families, 30 visits to parishioners in residential homes and 22 hospital visits. Main activities apart from visiting:

- The annual party for parishioners
- Lifts to church as and when possible
- Visits and help for the Mother and Baby Home
- Taking part in the sponsored walk
- Christmas gifts to the elderly housebound, people with disabilities and a needy family
- We have sponsored two young children in the poorest part of India to go to school at a cost of £15 per child per year
- We pay twinnage to India to aid SVP work there
- We donated to the Sudan Baby feeding programme
- We have made a one-off donation to a voluntary group who are providing sports and other activities for disabled children and teenagers; some of our parishioners are involved.

Financially we are very sound thanks to the legacy we received from Fr O'Connor.

If anyone would like a visit or knows of someone in need of a friendly chat please let us know. They do not have to be Catholic.
