25TH DECEMBER 2011 **CHRISTMAS DAY:** NATIVITY OF THE LORD Divine Office Proper of Season

There's a wonderful way in which the Christmas message emerges as we gather for the First Mass of Christmas: the first words of Scripture we hear are: "The people that walked in darkness have seen a great light." The mystery of Christmas is this - a great revelation: a light in the darkness, a star through the night, the birth of the Sun of Justice; the showing to the whole world of the love of God, made visible in Jesus. No wonder there is a great throng of the heavenly host shattering the darkness of the cold night on the hillside outside Bethlehem - because the invisible night of sin and sadness is shattered by the light of the Saviour's birth.



We begin our New Year with this feast of Mary. It is an integral part of the Christmas story that Mary responded to God's invitation to become the mother of his son. She enabled God's plan of salvation to be implemented. All the other celebrations focussing on Mary and all the qualities we attribute to her flow from this special role which she was willing to undertake. The gospel tells us that, at the visit of the shepherds, Mary "treasured all these things and pondered them in her heart." She became a faithful disciple of her son, was present at the foot of the cross, and was a witness to his resurrection.



Today is the 'Feast of the Manifestation', or the "Showing" of the Saviour to the whole world. In the wise men who travel from the East, we see all the nations other than the people of Israel being welcomed at the New Temple of the New Covenant - the new born child in the manger. A look at the Psalm response shows this: "All nations shall fall prostrate before you, O Lord." By this feast, we proclaim God's plan was to extend his salvation to men and women of every nation, of every time and every place - including us. In many ways this is our Christmas Feast, when we celebrate the Good News of the Saviour's birth revealed at last to us.
