The Eucharist is not an invention of the Church: it is a part of God's plan of salvation from the very beginning: it is prefigured in the Old Testament, seen today in the food offerings of Melchizedek, priest king of Jerusalem associated with Abraham, who chose bread and wine as the offerings. It is also revealed by the prophetic action of Jesus, in feeding the multitude, before he feeds the Church with the gift that is transmitted through the centuries. The Eucharist, the Body and Blood of Christ, is our communication with the Father, in the Spirit: it is the real presence in the Church's here and now of the eternal God; it is Covenant, Memorial and Promise, Meal and Sacrifice, the heartbeat of the Family of Believers.

The Body and Blood of Christ - Transubstantiation

As we celebrate the feast of Corpus Christi, I thought I would share with you the following reflection which was broadcast on Bolton FM's It's The Thought That Counts on Friday:

Yesterday was the feast of Corpus Christi and I spoke to you about the special gift that Christ gave to the Church at the Last Supper with his disciples – the gift of his Body and Blood. When he had blessed the bread and wine and shared them with his friends, he said "Do this in memory of me" – and that is what the Christian Church does each time it celebrates the Eucharist.

Of course, different Christian denominations have different understandings of exactly what happens in the Eucharist. For some the bread and wine are merely a symbolic representation of Christ's words and actions but for others, especially for the Catholic Church, the belief is that these elements of bread and wine really do become the Body and Blood of Christ.

This transformation, through the prayers of the priest, using the words of Christ and invoking the action of the Holy Spirit, has a technical title – Transubstantiation. The understanding of this, from the earliest days of the Church, and expressed in philosophical terms from that period, is that the substance of the bread and the wine is changed into the substance of Christ's Body and Blood by the words and actions of the celebration.

Perhaps one of the reasons that people sometimes find it hard to understand this conversion of the elements is because they retain their physical properties. So they still feel and taste like bread and wine – even though they are now something different. It is the conviction that they are now the Body and Blood of Christ that causes us to treat them with great respect and to reserve the Blessed Sacrament in our churches both for prayerful reverence and for taking Holy Communion to the sick.
