Today the Church celebrates the feast of the Presentation of the Lord which occurs forty days after the birth of Jesus and is also known as Candlemas day, since the blessing of candles is included in today's liturgy. Today's first reading gives us an important insight to understand profoundly the mystery of the Lord's Presentation in the Temple by Mary and Joseph, in accordance with the cannons of Mosaic Law. The text, taken from the Prophet Malachi says, 'I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before me; and suddenly there will come to the temple the Lord who you seek'.

#### The Presentation of the Lord

The second of February is the Feast of the Presentation or the Feast of Purification. It marks the day when Mary and Joseph observed the Jewish custom of taking their new born son, Jesus, to the temple in Jerusalem. The Jewish Law required that every first-born male child be consecrated to the Lord and a sacrifice of two turtle-doves (or young pigeons) be offered.

In the temple that day, Mary and Joseph encountered the holy man Simeon who spoke of Jesus as the light of the nations. He praised God for letting him live long enough to encounter Christ and uttered those words used every day in the Night Prayer of the Church "Now, Master, you can let your servant depart in peace". Simeon could surrender himself to death because he knew that, in Christ, salvation had come to the world.

The Feast of Purification or Presentation is also known as Candlemas because it is customary to bless the candles that will be used in a church during the coming year. Nowadays many people use candles as a regular thing within their homes, either to create a special atmosphere in a room or when they are sat around the table for a meal. Some of us will have had experience of power cuts when we had to depend on candles to be able to see. In those different contexts we can come to appreciate how powerful candlelight is. The candles that we use during our times of prayer are a specific reminder to us that Christ is the light of the world and he will guide us, especially in the darker moments of our lives. Today, let us pray for his guiding light to be with us, our families and our friends.
