Whoever remains in me, with me in him, bears fruit in plenty.

Last week it was sheep: this week, the vine. Jesus offers us another (agricultural) image to explain the mystery of his offering of himself, and our belonging to him, our being part of him, which comes about through the sacrament of Baptism. This is, as was stated earlier, the period of Mystagogy, when the newly baptised are helped to see what life in Jesus Christ really means. Today this comes out strongly for all of us, with two of the three readings emphasising the moral aspects of life in Christ: it is not simply enough to "belong" to him: our belonging must be shown by the works we do, by the fruits we bear while remembering of course that we cannot bear fruit except in him.

CAFOD Nepal Appeal: CAFOD has launched a £3 million emergency appeal following the devastating earthquake that hit Nepal last Saturday. An initial £100,000 has already been committed. The Disasters Emergency Committee (DEC), a coalition of leading aid agencies of which CAFOD is part, has also launched a joint appeal. Given the scale of the emergency in Nepal, we are holding a special collection at both this and next weekend's Masses to support CAFOD's response. Please also pray for the people of Nepal and the work of CAFOD, that they will respond with speed and compassion in support of our brothers and sisters. *Thank you*

Think Vocation

It is understandable how difficult the disciples found Saul's radical change of heart and direction towards Christ. Even today the Lord can invite people to radically change their way of living to serve in the Church. Let us ask St Paul's guidance and help for those who feel called to radically change the direction of their lives.

General Election 2015

As we prepare to cast our votes next Thursday, it is worth reminding ourselves of the letter from the Bishops of England and Wales, asking us to consider a range of issues that we should bear in mind. The bishops remind us that "whom you vote for is a matter for you alone" and that "voting in a general election should seldom, if ever, be based on a single issue". They invite us to think about policies that respect life, support marriage and family life, alleviate poverty, ensure faith-based education, help to build up our communities and show care and respect for our world.

Coalition for Marriage (C4M) has produced a number of leaflets about the change to the law on marriage and has asked people to consider this as one of the key issues. We are specifically asked to bear in mind that "when Parliament voted to redefine marriage for same-sex couples, your MP for Bolton North East David Crausby (Lab) voted courageously against it".

Prior to casting our vote, the bishops have suggested that we ask ourselves the question "How, in the light of the Gospel, can my vote best serve the common good?" and that we perhaps use this prayer: "Lord, grant us wisdom that we may walk with integrity, guarding the path of justice and knowing the protection of your loving care for us all".

Children's Liturgy (St. John's): When the building work starts here at St John's we will attempt to continue Children's Liturgy in the meeting room behind the sacristy. Due to the position and size of the room we will only be able to accommodate school age children who are confident to attend independently. To enable us to try this out we will also need another adult per session and ask for volunteers to see Father Cooke or Joanne, Amanda or Louise (the liturgy leaders) as soon as possible, thanks.

Final Audio Visual (AV) System Training Session: The recent training session was well received and the final AV training will take place on Saturday 16 May (10am-12noon) in the Harbour Room (SB). As only trained & authorised parishioners will be able to use the system, interested parishioners are encouraged to attend.
