A man can have no greater love than to lay down his life for his friends.



There are two obvious themes to today's readings: Saint Peter summarises many of the ideas of Easter baptism, the name of Jesus, the pouring out of the Holy Spirit; the other readings talk simply of love, both God's love for us and our love for each other. Our Gospel is taken from the great discourse at the Last Supper, and has at its centre the New Commandment that Jesus gives his disciples - the commandment of love. This love has its origins in the love of the Father, manifested in the love shown by the Son (willing to die for his friends); we, like the disciples, are called to imitate the love we see in Jesus' life and death - not because we are servants, but because we are friends.

Patmos Room: As reported just after Easter, we have now got the necessary permissions to go ahead with the extension of the Patmos Room. The appointed contractors are J Greenwood (Builders) Ltd from Oldham and they will be ready to start work on site from Monday 18 May. The new Patmos Room will be approximately twice the size of the existing one. Although described as an "extension", it will be necessary to demolish the existing walls in order to erect the new structure (based on a steel frame). The overall project, including some landscaping works, will take about five months to complete, during which time we will need to use the two side doors for access to the church.

In preparation for the start of this work, we will begin to remove things from the Patmos Room during the coming week, with a final clearance after the Masses next weekend. This Sunday will be the final Sunday for coffee after Mass but we will still have the Children's Liturgy in there next week (before we try out the alternative arrangements for a more limited group).

If you wish to learn more about this building project, there is a display in the Patmos Room and the architect (Keith Hamilton) will give a short talk about it after the 9.15 Mass next Sunday.

Gift Aid at St Columba's: We are seeking to revive the Gift Aid scheme at St Columba's. Gift Aid can be claimed for any money given by standing order, by cheque, or in the offertory envelopes, provided that we keep a record of it. In order to gift aid your donations, which costs you nothing but gets an extra 25p per \pounds 1 for the church, you simply need to fill out a Gift Aid declaration once. If you are a taxpayer, please do consider signing one of these forms so that we can boost our income in this way. Even if you are not a taxpayer, you might wish to make your contributions by standing order rather than envelope or loose money. Chris Molyneaux has kindly offered to be the Gift Aid Coordinator at St Columba's and he will be present at the back of church after the two Masses next weekend with the necessary forms. Thank you.
