Go and sell everything you own and follow me.



In today's story of the rich young man, who comes to Jesus full of good intentions, there are some simple words that speak so clearly to our own age: when Jesus tells him to sell everything and give it to the poor, "his face fell at these words, and he went away sad, for he was a man of great wealth." How sad it is that such a keen (he runs up to Jesus), and by all accounts good young man (whom Jesus loves) could not free himself from the one thing that was holding him back: his dependence on money. Jesus' words "How hard it is..." perhaps indicate his own sadness that the young man could not free himself from this. Jesus' teaching was new - as the disciples' reaction shows. In Israel at the time, riches were thought to be a blessing from God. But as Jesus knew and taught, holding on to anything that passes away can distract us from holding on to things that are eternal.

Building Update

St Columba's Presbytery: Some of you will have seen a skip arrive at the presbytery on Thursday and a few volunteers to-ing and fro-ing with boxes etc. This is because work is about to commence on our urgently needed new heating system (in preparation for the winter) and on the demolition of the presbytery. We are waiting for the results of the usual surveys and then work will commence. Most of the furniture from inside the Presbytery will be given to the British Heart Foundation and as carpets etc were destroyed during the flood, they will be placed in the skip along with any other items that are unfit for purpose. After having had all our recent vandalism and break-ins these steps to make St Columba's a more secure building are necessary and, with the addition of a brand new heating system, will make the running costs more effective. We thank you for your patience and understanding with this project, and hope that there will be minimum disruption.

St John's Patmos Room Extension: Work is continuing at the expected pace, though of course the initial problem with the foundations did put the project back by several weeks. So completion is now expected in November rather than October. Once the project is complete, we will have a very useful meeting space and a great enhancement to this church.

Finances: Much as we dislike talking about money, you will all be aware that building work (even demolition) is quite expensive. Given these two current projects, and the previous extensive work at St Brendan's, we will need to have a fund-raising drive in the not too distant future. Any ideas for raising funds would be welcome.
