This Sunday we drop back into Saint Luke's Gospel with the dramatic story of the raising of the widow's son in the town of Nain. A 'theme' that can unite the scriptures today is found in the psalm: "For me you have changed my mourning into dancing." Our faith is that the death and resurrection of Jesus has changed death forever – just as both Jesus and Elijah changed it in the stories read today. Christians will mourn the death of loved ones, just as Jesus himself wept over his friend Lazarus: but Christian mourning, while acknowledging grief, will also contain - in Jesus - the hope of dancing, the hope of life, the hope of resurrection, as revealed in our readings today.

First World War Centenary: As part of the ongoing centenary remembrance of significant moments in the First World War, the Bishops of England and Wales are encouraging the Catholic community to participate in local civic or ecumenical celebrations to commemorate the Battle of Jutland and the Battle of the Somme. Catholic parishes are asked to mark these important anniversaries on the nearest Sunday to 5 June to commemorate the Battle of Jutland and the 3 July to commemorate the Battle of the Somme, by offering Mass for all those who died and to pray for those currently serving in the armed forces, and for peace. Bishop John will offer Mass for those intentions in the Cathedral this Sunday (5 June) at 5.30pm and at 11.00am on Sunday 3 July.

Religious Artefacts from Belarus: With Bishop John's permission, an order of Russian Orthodox Sisters is currently visiting parishes in our diocese to sell various religious artefacts made in their workshops to support their charitable work. Taking up the ministry of their patron saint (St Elisabeth) the sisters provide spiritual and social help to the sick and the suffering. One of the sisters will be bringing a small display of their crafts to **St Brendan's on Monday 6 June** for sale after the 9.30am Mass. If you are able to go along and support this, please do so.
