4 February 2018 Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time



This world, as we know, is a fragile and fallible place, in which we encounter hunger, disease, sickness and death. Jesus proclaims, by his actions of healing, that there is another

world, the Kingdom of God, which will be free from all such anxieties and afflictions. The story of Paradise and the Garden of Eden painted a picture of a world which was perfect, and free from all problems. Jesus came into the world precisely to offer us a return to Eden, if we follow him. Each of his miracles is also, in some sense, a parable or teaching, pointing out to us something of the lost happiness and perfection which he is restoring. This vision of Paradise is not Utopian or delusory, not just a vain hope to comfort us with, but the true manifestation of God's love for us. Jesus could not cure every disease or sickness in the world then: but his miracles of healing are a sign that one day, when the Kingdom comes, sickness and disease will be wiped away for ever.

Marriage Matters: Making the time to talk and to listen - As married couples we need time to grow in knowledge and understanding of each other. This week let us make time when we are not tired, to talk together, to share what's happened in the day, our thoughts and feelings, the things that worry us or make us happy. Perhaps we can also plan a regular celebration of our love.

Think Vocation: In the Gospel we see a day in the life of Jesus. It was busy but he made time for prayer. Let us remember those men and women who serve the Church in the contemplative religious life. Their mission is to support, through prayer, those who are busy with the apostolic work of the Church. May others be drawn to live this vital and generous way of living the Christian vocation.

Salford Diocesan 2018 Pilgrimage to Lourdes

2018 is the 160thAnniversary of the Apparition of Our Lady to St Bernadette at Lourdes and our Diocesan Pilgrimage will take place there from 27July to 2 August. Perhaps the dates will help with forward planning for those thinking about joining the Parish group to Lourdes this year.

The application forms showing hotel details and prices are not, as yet, available but last year our party stayed at the Hotel Roissy and came back with good reports all round. It makes sense therefore to opt for this hotel again, if it is listed. It will be a popular venue and we will need to get our bookings in as early as possible.

The cost, last year, was £735 per person including Flight and Full Board but with no reduction for children. This year should be similarly priced.

If you are thinking about going please advise Margaret Russell at St John's, Peter Carolan at St Brendan's or myself, also at St Brendan's, as soon as you can, so that we can let you have more accurate information as it becomes available.

On a slightly different note you may wish to know about a voluntary donation fund which was set up some 3 or 4 years ago to enable Canon Michael to discretely offer a subsidy to parents to offset child attendance costs.
