Fourth Sunday in Lent - Laetare Sunday





There were two remarkable moments in the story of the Old Testament where God saved his people; one was in the escape from Egypt - we'll keep that for the Easter Vigil. The other was the end of their second exile, this time in Babylon, which we hear of

today. Of course there was an even greater moment when God saved his people: the work of Jesus Christ, the Son of God - and we hear Jesus tell Nicodemus about that today. So today's theme is "salvation": but to understand "being saved", we must ask "What from?" Saved from slavery, from exile, from human enemies - these are all clear. But the last and greatest salvation brought by Jesus is harder to understand: saved from sin and death. These threaten us as much as any other enemy and our salvation in Jesus is as real as any other.

Think Vocation: St Paul tells us that when we were dead through our sins, God brought us to life with Christ. Through our baptism we are called to be witnesses to our faith to others. Let us make an effort to contact and encourage those we know who are of our faith but no longer practise. A simple word of encouragement can sometimes lead people to rediscover the richness of God's love offered in Christ Jesus.

Marriage Matters: Called to be a 'sign': The world often ridicules marriage saying 'it's just a piece of paper', but Scripture draws attention to God's powerful message. St. Paul says: "We are God's work of art; created in Christ Jesus to live the good life as from the beginning He had meant us to live it." Let us shine out so the world sees what it's missing.

New Appointment: As you know from the announcement made at the Masses last weekend, I have been appointed as Moderator of the Curia with effect from Easter Sunday. This position is assigned to a Vicar General and is about oversight and co-ordination of all the central diocesan services (administrative and advisory) which support our parishes and schools. The new role will require me to move to a parish nearer to Cathedral Centre sometime shortly after Easter. Although nothing has yet been decided about my new accommodation, it is likely that Sunday 6 May will be my final Sunday here. Thank you for all your good wishes that were expressed last weekend. Update on Finances: The figures published last week for February were based on the items we knew had gone in and out of the accounts up to 27 Feb (when we prepared the newsletter). Having now seen the bank statement, there were some additional transactions on the last day of the month. These were Standing Order payments in (amounting to £133) and a recharge from the diocese for the January wages (£2088). This increases the monthly overspend from £977 to £2898. Leaving aside the expenditure for St Columba's (which continues to go out despite no related income), Corpus Christi parish has now overspent by about £5000 so far this year. If that continues to be the pattern throughout the year, then we would have an annual overspend of around £30,000 (and we would use up our reserves in about five years).



CAFOD: Thank you for your generosity in the Fast Day collection which amounted to £1,842.43 This has now been sent off, together with the proceeds of the Ceilidh (£664) and other CAFOD income received this year, making a grand total of £2,907.98 (which the government will double). Thank you to those who gift-aided their contributions which will bring in a further £228.25 to CAFOD (hopefully also doubled).
