18 March 2018 Fifth Sunday in Lent



In the weeks of Lent so far, we have followed God's work of salvation: we have seen the Covenants he established with Noah, Abraham, Moses and the people of Israel after the return from Babylon. Now we come to one of the most significant parts

of the Old Testament: the promise of a brand-new Covenant, which will be different from all those that went before. This Covenant will see God and Man living more closely together. For the ratification of a Covenant, something was always sacrificed as a sign of the new relationship normally man would offer some animal offering to God. But the New Covenant will be ratified not with the death of sheep or bull, but by the death of Jesus Christ, God and Man. In this perfect sacrifice is the source of our eternal salvation.

Think Vocation: St Paul tells us that Christ became a source of Salvation for all who obey him. All those who serve as priests or Religious promise obedience. Saying yes to the requests of our Bishops or superiors in order to remain faithful to God and the life we are committed to is not always easy. God works throughout the authority of the Church. Let us pray for our Bishop that the sometimes difficult decisions he has to make will be done justly and with the prayer filled guidance of the Holy Spirit.

Marriage Matters: Unconditional love: Love is called to be unconditional, not 'counting the cost', not 50/50, but both giving 100%. Today's Gospel reminds us a rich harvest is only possible when a single wheat grain falls on the ground and dies. Our loving efforts, trials and difficulties in marriage are ways of 'dying' to a lifestyle contrary to what God is calling us to.

As we now have the application forms available, indicating this year's precise costs, you may wish to give further consideration to joining up with a fairly well-established Parish group who would more than welcome your company.

We intend to use the Hotel Roissy, as per last year, where the cost for full board is £759 in a twin or treble room. Unfortunately, there is an additional charge of £216 for single rooms, of which there are only a limited number available.

There is a considerable saving to be had, therefore, if you could mutually arrange to share with others in a twin or treble.

Please return the completed forms to me as soon as possible so that I can quickly submit all forms together (the hotel is very popular).
