“Behave humbly and then you will find favour with the Lord.” The Lord can work with us most readily and easily when we are most disposed to the work of the Holy Spirit. When we know that we depend for everything in our lives upon God then we are being truly humble. Let us pray for the gift of humility upon those in positions of authority within the Church.

# Global Healing


Pope Francis has established 1 September as the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, encouraging the Catholic community around the world to pray for our common home. The annual Day of Prayer is inspired by his landmark encyclical *Laudato Si'*, which calls on “every person living on this planet” to care for our shared earth.

Pope Francis calls us all to celebrate this opportune moment to “reaffirm [our] personal vocation to be stewards of creation, to thank God for the wonderful handiwork which he has entrusted to our care, and to implore his help for the protection of creation, as well as his pardon for the sins committed against the world in which we live.”

This World Day of Prayer also falls at the beginning of Creation Time, which runs until 4 October, the feast of St Francis of Assisi. This is an ecumenical season dedicated to prayer for the protection of Creation and the promotion of sustainable lifestyles

**God of all goodness,  
you have fed us with these sacramental gifts.  
“Bring healing to our lives,  
that we may protect the world and not prey on it,  
that we may sow beauty, not pollution and destruction.  
Touch the hearts  
of those who look only for gain
