Weekly Reflection Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time with grateful thanks to David Frank

Zechariah 9: 9-101 Psalm 144 Romans 8: 9,11-13 Matthew 11; 25-30

Certain words can make us turn off; they represent something in which we either have no interest or we lack understanding. One of these words, often used in our church, is "Spirituality". To the ordinary person in the street it has little or no meaning, to the catholic in the pew it means "holy" people, those who pray a lot; many people, I fear, do not consider themselves spiritual. Yet we are called to live "spiritual lives".

Paul speaks to us today, in the passage from Romans, about Spirituality. He divides the people of his time into spiritual and unspiritual; between those who believe in Jesus Christ and those who do not. He also believes that Christians live their lives in a spiritual way because the Spirit of Christ is living in them. They have no need for the unspiritual side of life for they are filled with the gifts of the Spirit.

Now this is where, I believe, we need to reconsider our views on spirituality; if we have the spirit living within us He brings us His gifts: wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety and fear of the Lord, Enabled by these gifts we can live our lives in a way pleasing to God, we can become more understanding of our own and other people's needs, we can become more wise in dealing with the ways of the world. Read again the passage from Zechariah; he speaks of a king riding on a donkey;

only the wise could see this as a king who wants to serve his people, not rule over them. Only those who understand the true nature of the life of Jesus can see that through these gifts we can we bring peace to our planet.

Spiritual people are often seen as childlike: unable to handle the outside world, they lock themselves away in their prayer books and their studies. In the Gospel, Jesus explains,

that unless we look at things through the eyes of a child, we will not be able to see the kingdom of heaven.

Children love naturally; they see things in a very different way to adults. Through love we can build the kingdom here on earth; it will be difficult; we need to start in our homes and our neighbourhoods. Remember Jesus is there beside us shouldering the load when it becomes too heavy. We are in the service of God. Let's start today.

Feed the Hungry - Funding for Food Vouchers Available Now

Whilst Caritas welcomes the news that the government will be extending the free school meals vouchers to children during the summer holiday period, the reality is that many families across the Diocese of Salford will still find themselves going hungry, having to make the stark choice of paying the bills or buying food for the family.

The Albert Gubay Charitable Foundation is offering grants to alleviate this suffering in the context of the Covid 19 pandemic and has allocated £8,400 to Caritas to distribute across the Diocese according to where there is most need. This will be in the form of money for you to use to purchase and distribute food youchers.

This funding is available NOW on a first come, first served basis to all our parishes and schools across the Diocese. Please circulate this information to all individuals or groups in your parish community who are involved in local social action work and may know of families who would benefit from receiving financial assistance in the form of food vouchers at this time. Please do not let any family in need in your parish miss out!

To apply, please email Mike Coen at m.coen@caritassalford.org.uk stating:

Name and location of your parish.

Amount of funding you are requesting for the purchase of food vouchers.

Number of families and number of individual adults and children in each family you are wishing to support.

What impact this will have (we require this information for the funders) and any relevant additional background information.

NB: Any agreed funding will be transferred to your relevant parish account for the purchase of food vouchers from the local supermarket of your choice to pass onto the families concerned.

Applications received from parishes must be endorsed by the Parish Priest.

Gubay Crisis Fund

In addition, please do not forget to access the Gubay Crisis Fund too. A sum of £10,000 is available until the end of September from which one-off payments of up to £400 per family can be made to
