Weekly Reflection

We all love to hear stories; good books have an ability to make words come to life in our imaginations, and we become part of the story as we are changed, transformed, by the truths sheltering behind the words. Jesus was a master storyteller; He lived in a time when most people were illiterate and he who could tell a good story was at the centre of community life. When Jesus spoke, people listened. He spoke, often in parables, painting pictures with his words, so that those who listened could grasp the meaning of message.

Two images emerge from today's readings, but there are several levels of meaning caught in the words we hear. The first image is of the world. When God created the world, He saw "that it was good" but sin and death entered the world through human failings and the devil, Satan, and so it became a battleground between good and evil. Our first reading from Wisdom reminds us of the care and mercy of God and our response must be as the virtuous man who "must be kindly to his fellow men". If we love our neighbour then the power of evil can be defeated, and we will can gain repentance.

The second image is how goodness spreads through the world through the way we live our lives. Saint Paul urges us to listen to the Holy Spirit for "*The Spirit comes to help us in our weakness*" and "*expresses our plea in a way that can never be put into words*". God's work in our world is often hidden and emerges in simple acts of love, there is no "great action" only a slow turning away from sin so that God's purpose comes to fruition in the hearts of those who listen

When we read the parables in today's Gospel, we are reminded that, despite our good works, there is often a malign influence, sowing evil, in our world but, when the final judgement comes, that evil will be taken and destroyed. Faith is like a mustard seed; it begins small, but, if nurtured, it can grow and create God's kingdom among us. Yeast when mixed with flour seems to disappear but like the seed it works unseen changing slowly until bread is created to feed the Body of Christ, to lead us to His kingdom. In these simple words, Jesus speaks to the hearts of His listeners and the harvest is found in our response. *With thanks to: David Frank*
