Second Sunday in Lent



There is always something special about a gift. Whether it is a birthday card a small child has made at nursery and presented to a parent or a diamond ring of great value, the gift always flows from the heart of the giver to the one who receives it. Gifts are special blessings.

Today's readings remind us of the importance of gifts in our lives. Abraham and Sarah were old; they were childless but, through the gift of God, they were given a child, Isaac, who they loved and cherished. God, however, put Abraham to the test and asked him to sacrifice his only son as a burnt offering. Can you imagine the anguish felt by Abraham at this request? God, who had given him so much, especially his precious son, was asking him to give up that very son, the treasure of his heart. Abraham had a tremendous faith in God and did as he was asked. He took Isaac to the mountain and God, seeing his faith, rescinded his command and the child lived.

Paul speaks to the Romans and, in our day, he speaks to us. His words are a gift "With God on our side who can be against us". We need to understand and accept the gift behind these words for, "nothing can separate us from the love of God". Paul reminds us that God is a loving father and like Abraham, He was willing to sacrifice His only son for our sake; for our sins and our transgressions and to bring us closer to Him. In God's case the Son is sacrificed, but through that sacrifice, we have the gifts of Forgiveness and Eternal Life and we have a powerful advocate to speak for us in the courts of heaven.

Peter, James, and John receive a gift on behalf of the whole human family when they journey with Jesus to Mount Tabor. On that mountain they are given a glimpse of heaven. We cannot know what heaven is like no matter how we speculate upon it. What we do know is that, in heaven, we will be held in the loving arms of God for eternity. Moses and Elijah are dead, they died hundreds of years before the birth of Christ; yet they are here in the presence of the living. The apostles experience of the transfiguration changes them forever; let us pray that, this Lent, we too will experience a transformation through the Gift of love expressed in the death and resurrection of Our Lord. *David Frank*
