

30 May 2021 The Most Holy Trinity



Can you remember when you first made the Sign of the Cross; for most of us it would have been a long time ago when we were infants. We may have been shown by our parents or copied an older brother or sister or perhaps we learnt to make the sign by a teacher at school. No

matter who our first teacher was, we should be eternally grateful to them, for this sign is the most powerful symbol that we will ever make.

When we invoke the Trinity; Father, Son and Holy Spirit, we claim for ourselves our dignity as followers of Christ, we name the God in whom we believe and who has named us in our Baptism. In some traditions the very movement from head to chest and to each shoulder indicates that we are opening ourselves to God who is in our head so we may understand, our hearts so we may know His love and on our shoulders upon which we take the heavy load that God gives us the strength to carry.

Today's readings speak to us of these gifts of understanding, love, and strength. In the first reading Moses speaks to the people about the Commandments of God; he urges them to understand and take to heart the Word of God present in His law. If we have the strength to keep his Law, then our reward is prosperity and long life for us and our children.

Paul speaks of the Father as "Abba" (Daddy) and urges us to live in harmony with the Holy Spirit. Through this we become children of God and coheirs with Christ.

Matthew's Gospel is a call to us to pass the Sacrament of Baptism to our children and our children's children. There can be no more precious gift than this sacrament. It is freely offered to all, no matter what the circumstances. Through the gifts, given to us at Baptism, we have become "sons and daughters of God". It is difficult for us to understand this concept, Baptism is not just a rite of passage into the Church; it is an opening of the gateway to everlasting life. **David Frank**
