What kind of disciple are you? You may think that you are not a disciple, because you don't go round pushing your beliefs on people or you may not live a particularly good Christian life, let's face it we all struggle with life's problems and at times we lose our tempers and walk away from situations that a "disciple" would stay and confront. We are all human, we are not perfect, faith teaches us that we are always growing in our life with God. As a gardener, and not a particularly successful one, I know that at times my garden does not bloom. Seeds fail to germinate, the birds pinch my fruit, tomatoes stay green, but that does not stop me from trying again. It's the same with our faith, we are disciples because, no matter what setbacks we face we still persist in trying to do good things.

In our first reading Isaiah speaks to us about the problems of discipleship; he endures because of the helping hand of God. No matter what he faces the Lord will be with him, giving him the strength and determination, he needs to confront the world. The psalmist echoes the words of Isaiah, his God "protects the simple hearts, I was helpless, so he saved me". James as ever offers common sense advice. What is the use of faith without good works? Discipleship is a means of sharing the love of God with all who are in need, and to do it in practical ways. Whatever you do, wherever you go, take the love of God with you and your life will be a testimony to your faith.

We must never be afraid of doubt. Our Gospel passage asks us that basic question of belief "Who do people say I am? Jesus asks this to test his apostles, those who are closest to Him. It is a question each of us must answer. To be a disciple we must believe that Jesus is the Son of God. Some days this belief can be tested by the challenges of life, sometimes we believe but we still ask "What is God doing?" especially in troubling situations. Perhaps He is waiting for a disciple to look at the situation and say "I will go there, and I will help". *David Frank*

Our dedicated members of staff, assisted by wonderful volunteers in each of the dropoff centres, are currently sorting through items and arranging deliveries based on these requested needs.


For this reason, we are able to accept the donated items you have already collected in your area with sincere gratitude, and politely ask that no more appeals for further items are made just at this time please.
