# 12 December Gaudete Sunday





Today is Gaudete Sunday, a day of joy and rejoicing. The Lord is very near, and we need to prepare for His coming. The people of the Old Testament were a

people waiting, they were a small nation surrounded by powerful enemies. They were sustained by their faith in the One True God who would bring them their salvation. The prophet Zephaniah proclaims, "Shout for joy...the Lord is in your midst, you have no more evil to fear". So, they waited, not in fear, but in hope for His coming.

Long after Zephaniah, the prophet, was dust in the earth, another takes his place. John, the voice in the wilderness, and the people flock to him hoping their redemption was at hand. When you are a poor impoverished nation, under the grip of a ruthless, tyrannical conqueror what can you offer? what can you do? The gift that God looks for is that of themselves, they must give up their selfish ways and create a world where everything is shared. They must act with fairness, taking only what is their due, they must act with integrity, with sympathy, for those who are poor and rejected. For after John will come another, baptising with the Holy Spirit and fire. and when He comes, they must be ready.

Some years later, Paul writes to the Philippians, he has witnessed the events that followed the Resurrection of Christ. He knows that God has visited His people and that the kingdom of God is very near. The people Paul is speaking to are waiting for the return of their saviour. They must take off the cloak of fear and despair, they must clothe themselves in the joy and hope of Christ. Paul tells them "I want you to be happy". He urges them to live in tolerance and peace, praying constantly for anything they need and in thanksgiving for the gifts that God has given them. With hindsight we know that this time of waiting was not to be measured in months or years, but in centuries, in millennia, and still we wait. We cannot understand the mind of God but, if we wait in joy and hope, His peace will come to us, and then we can truly rejoice. David Frank

Pope John Paul II said, "The liturgy of Advent...helps us to understand fully the value and meaning of the mystery of Christmas. It is not just

about commemorating the historical event, which occurred some 2,000 years ago. Instead, it is necessary to understand that the whole of our life must be an 'advent,' a vigilant awaiting of the final coming of Christ. To predispose our mind to welcome the Lord who, as we say in the Creed, one day will come to judge the living and the dead, we must learn to recognize him as present in the events of daily life. Therefore, Advent is, so to speak, an intense training that directs us decisively toward him who already came, who will come, and comes continuously.
