Peter's Prayer

Lord,

You call me to be your disciple, to go out into the world and spread your word, you promise me a disciple's tongue, so that I will know how to speak.

You need me to do this every day, when I awake, I hear your voice, through the day, I feel your presence, when evening comes, your peace surrounds me, when sleep comes, I know you are watching, until daybreak.

But I am so small, I am unworthy of your faith in me, unworthy of your love I try, I fail, but I persevere, for I know your faith in me is beyond my understanding.

I do not turn away from those who do not listen, nor turn my back on those who despise me, I accept whatever comes because I know you are always at my side.

Wherever I walk, I follow you,

Whenever I speak, your voice is heard, When I reach out to one of my brothers or sisters it is your hands, your touch, that they feel. Amen

We meet Peter in today's Gospel. He is a man who is headstrong, full of bravado, given to sudden insights of faith, and very, very human. Jesus recognises his giftedness and his faults. He is a good judge of character and in Peter he sees something of every man, every woman, who has ever walked the earth.

Jesus uses Peter's impetuousness, his humanity, to bring us to a better understanding of ourselves. We want to be Peter; we want to say to our Lord; "Lord, I will never let you down, I will never deny you." Jesus knows that within the human spirit there is a generosity of love which always tries, often fails but always perseveres.

In today's passion narrative Peter denies Christ and across a crowded courtyard Jesus looks at Peter and for a moment time stands still. Jesus could have condemned Peter at that moment, and, like Judas, Peter may have never recovered from that experience. But Jesus does not; instead, He uses the moment to teach Peter perhaps the final lesson on his journey to understanding.

Fr John McNamara RIP

Fr McNamara was in his ninety first year, the sixty-fourth year of his Sacred Priesthood. May he rest in peace.

Fr John was born on 4 June 1931 in Farnworth, Bolton and baptised on 28 June at St Gregory's Church, Farnworth. He was educated at St Gregory's Elementary School and De La Salle College, Pendleton. He was accepted as an Ecclesiastical student for the Diocese of Salford in September 1952 and studied at St Cuthbert's College, Ushaw. Father John McNamara was ordained to the Priesthood at Our Lady of Lourdes, Farnworth on 27 July 1958 and served the Diocese of Salford in the following appointments:

1958-1964: St. Edmunds, Little Hulton 1964-1971: St Hugh of Lincoln, Stretford 1971-1974: St Columba's, Tonge Moor, 1974-1977: Immaculate Conception, Haslingden 1977-1995: St Charles, Rishton Parish Priest 1995-2009: Ss Peter and Paul, Bolton In 2009, Fr John retired.
