experiencing now, the people always turned to the church as the rock of certainty in the whirlpool of fear and concern. Today it appears that the human family have turned away from the spiritual and moved towards the secular life; a life in which selfishness and greed lead to war, economic uncertainty, unemployment, and depression.

You can never underestimate the power of the Holy Spirit. It is a constant in our ever-changing world. It has the power to change hearts and minds and is our loving guide and protector. We need, especially at this time to focus more and more on the message of Christ. If we follow his commandment of love, then the Holy Spirit will be with us and lead us through the uncertainty into a brighter future. Just consider the scene in the room where the disciples were; the doors were locked out of fear for their lives; they faced a future without their leader, Jesus, and all their hopes hung by a thread.

It was not a mighty wind that that swept through that room but a hurricane; a gift from God that raised their spirits and gave them the courage and the confidence to face the world. I do not know how many disciples were gathered; perhaps twenty or thirty, probably no more than that, but from that room came an avalanche that changed the world so completely that those twenty or thirty became tens of millions. That is the power of the Holy Spirit which we celebrate today.

At a more personal level the Spirit works in each individual who is open to the Word of God; if we follow Christ and keep his word then the Spirit will remain with us and guide us in the way we live our life. Quarant'ore Mission at Salford Cathedral Monday 13 - Friday 17 June, 10am-5.45pm each day Salford Cathedral, Chapel Street, Salford M3 5LL: Salford Cathedral will host Quarant'ore, an ancient Church practice, consisting of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament for 40 hours. The Sacrament will be exposed and there will be adoration throughout the day. The cathedral will be open to all who want to spend some prayerful time with the Lord. Quarant'ore stretches back beyond written memory - in the 1500s, St Charles Borromeo explained that the practice was ancient, and that the 40 hours referred to the time Christ's body laid in the tomb.
