

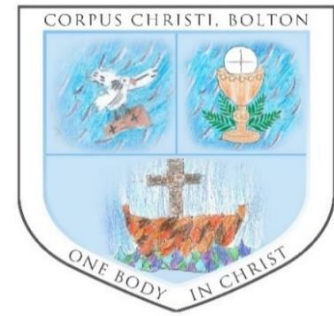

Twentieth Week in Ordinary Time

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary



Today's readings speak of Heaven, of everlasting life, of what lies before us when our earthly journey comes to an end. They are full of hope, a vision of awe and majesty, a promise of immortality, and finally a story of two women meeting and celebrating the goodness of God.

The Book of the Apocalypse is the final book in the Old Testament. It is attributed to John, the youngest Apostle, the author of the Gospel written in his name. It is a strange book, difficult to follow, everything is on a grand scale, the language is dramatic yet at times so very human. The image of the woman is familiar to us, we see a representation of Mary the mother of Jesus threatened by a dragon, she is saved from death by God, her child taken up to heaven, while she escapes into the desert. Whatever threatens us in this life, God stands beside us, keeping us from harm, leading us to our heavenly home, all we have to do is follow him and keep His word.

Paul speaks to us of Christ and His resurrection. If we believe that one man, Jesus, was raised from the dead then we can believe that all humanity can also follow Jesus and be brought to life in Christ. This is the source of our hope of eternal life.

In today's Gospel Mary walks through the hill country of Judea to her cousin Elizabeth's house, longing to tell her story of the happenings in her life but also willing to sit and listen to her cousin for she too has her story to share. Two women, both with the experience of the miracle of conception, both called to share their lives forever with the rest of humankind. Mary is young, Elizabeth is old, but both feel the gift of life stirring in their bodies. John, in Elizabeth's womb greets Jesus, in Mary's womb, with a leap of joy. Both women have tales to tell, Elizabeth of the miracle of conception in old age and Mary, in the realisation of the tremendous steps that her life has taken, bursting with a hymn of praise to the God who has lifted her up, filled her with great joy. *David Frank*
