The Nativity of the Lord





There are four sets of readings for the feast of Christmas and, if read in sequence, they create a patchwork of scripture on which we can place the emotions which we experience at this most holy time of our year. Let us look at the four Gospel passages and immerse ourselves into this most special of days.

The Gospel for the Vigil Mass has two quite separate themes, both of which remind us that the birth of Christ cannot be celebrated as an event outside of human experience. Matthews Gospel begins with a list of the ancestors of Our Lord; through this list we see that we all belong to the same human family which is made up of a great variety of saints and sinners. Matthew tells the nativity story through the eyes of Joseph; he reminds us of the great humanity of this man who took on the role of father to the Son of God. It is almost impossible to imagine the enormity of the task that Joseph accepted with such humility.

At Midnight we have the Gospel of Luke; this is the familiar story of the Inn and the Stable. The Son of God, laid in a feeding trough for the animals of the field; each of us may have had somewhere warm to be born but not Christ. The passage reminds us that Jesus is indeed Lord of All; He can relate through His birth with the humblest of those born into our world. We hear, once again, the songs of the angels and the call to the shepherds to come and worship. The Dawn Mass continues Luke's story as the shepherds come before their king with their stories of heavenly song and bright shining stars. This is Mary's story as she listens in wonder to the way the news of her baby's birth has been given to the waiting world.

Finally, with the Day Mass, we have John speaking of the Light that has come into our world through the birth of a tiny baby. This passage reminds us that God the Son was there at the beginning of the World and is part of the creation story. This is our story: He is the Word by which we live, die and rise to eternal life, that He is our All in All, the light that turns our dark corners into bright tomorrows, full of grace and love. *David Frank*
