Sixth Sunday of Easter



The Holy Spirit is the presence of God in our lives. When something is beyond our imagination, yet we believe in its presence, we often clothe that belief in “mystery”. To those who cannot understand, who do not have faith, this may appear to be nonsense but to believers in Jesus and His word it gives hope, and that hope is what keeps us in communion with Him. The early church lived close to this mystery, their faith was so strong that they had to go out to the world and proclaim it. We meet people today who have a certain aura around them, and we recognise in them this same Spirit; the Spirit that we need to sustain us in this troubled world.

It took great courage for Philip to go to the Samaritan people to proclaim the Christ to them. There was enmity between the two groups caused by events that happened many hundreds of years before and the two simply did not mix. Jesus had shown the disciples before, in His meeting with the woman at the well, that, to God, this division did not exist and so Philip followed His example and was received with great joy. The Spirit of God was enkindled in the people of Samaria, and many came to believe in the message of Christ.

Peter talks of reverencing the Lord in our hearts. When we take courage and speak about our faith, we find a sense of peace within ourselves because we carry with us the Spirit of God; we may not always be welcomed, our voices may not always be heard or understood. The early believers often suffered persecution and death because of their faith and we, in our own time, are often scorned by those who have no faith, but we should persevere for, through our word and example we may find a small flame of faith is planted on the lives of those who listen.

Today we continue the “farewell discourse” in John’s Gospel. There is a feeling here of Jesus reaching out to each of us with words of reassurance and faith. He understands how His disciples are struggling with their understanding of the events that are to come. They see Him is imperishable, as the Messiah who will lead Israel to triumph over its enemies. They cannot grasp that the battle is for people’s hearts not for worldly gains. Jesus promises them a Spirit of Truth, that same Spirit is with us today if only we can find belief in His power. *David Frank*
