20 August 2023 Twentieth Sunday Ordinary Time



Compassion for people who have different cultures or beliefs is the cornerstone of today's readings. The Old Testament world was, in essence, very tribal. A place where the strong ruled over the weak and often made slaves of those who lived beside them but did not belong. It was a world of strong religious beliefs, mainly in what we would call "pagan gods", the people were struggling to understand what life, and death, really meant and turned to familiar objects as subjects of their worship.

The passage from Isaiah makes it very clear that, from earliest times, those who serve the Lord, Jews or foreigners, are acceptable to Him. They must however "care for justice", and "act with integrity" for this will be the sign that they are pleasing to God. As we read these words from the prophet it is clear that everyone who follows the Commandments of the Lord is welcome in His house; "a house of prayer for all the peoples". Faith in Christ was never solely for the Jews; the call of Jesus to go out into the world to make disciples of all nations led to the missionary journeys of Saint Paul. In this passage from his letter to the Romans Paul uses the example of the "pagans" and their whole hearted acceptance of Jesus Lord and contrasts this with as the intransigence of the Jewish people who do not accept Him. Paul prays for a change of heart from the Jewish people so that the mercy of God can be shown to all people.

The mercy of God manifests itself in the compassion we show to others. In the story of the Canaanite woman the disciples show compassion for the pleas of the woman for the release of her daughter from the torments of the devil. Jesus seems to cling to the belief that only the Jews are worthy of God's mercy; perhaps he does this to test the response from the disciples to see if they believe that the mercy of God is for everyone who has faith in Him. The disciples take up her cause and ask Jesus to grant her wish. Now, in our day, we too must follow the example of the disciples for unless we act with that same compassion how can the mercy of God enter our world. David Frank


