Every so often we come across a reading which touches something deep within us. It is a graced moment, a time to stop and read again, trying to come to an understanding of the word that has been proclaimed. The writer of the Book of Wisdom captures a gift from God and reveals it to us so that we may seek for it and, if we find it, hold it close and never let it go.

Perhaps the greatest gift we can wish for is Wisdom. mistakes, All the all the misunderstandings, everything we have done wrong, all could have been avoided if we made use of the God given gift of wisdom. We search for that gift all our lives, yet it is always there, just in front of us, hiding in plain sight. It may be found in the words of our parents, our teachers and even in the words and actions we see, every day, in our friends and our neighbours but we are so busy looking for it that we do not see it. Today we are asked to watch for it, to be alert for signs, and to grasp it and use it to govern our decisions and our plans for the future.

Are we judgmental when we hear the parable of the ten bridesmaids? It is so easy to call the five who have oil as wise and the other five as foolish but how often have we planned an event then, at the last moment realise that we have forgotten something, and we rush around trying to correct our mistakes. It is very easy to criticise, it is very difficult to be perfect. Whenever I listen to this parable, I feel sorry for the five who are not admitted to the wedding hall, I can see they may be foolish but they are so, so, human. Perhaps Our Lord is not judging the foolishness of the bridesmaids but reminding us that we need to be prepared every day to meet the Lord and, when we do so, present Him with a wise heart briming over with forgiveness and understanding.
