Sixteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time

We are called today to be shepherds to the people who we meet. What does that mean? Perhaps the simplest way of understanding this call is through that well-loved psalm "The Lord is My Shepherd". If you read the psalm and take the Lord's promises as your own, and live by His word, then you can fulfil your calling. In the first verse you are called to form an atmosphere of peace in your life so that others can share in this peace and "revive their drooping spirits". The second verse calls us to be faithful and true to the Lord's teachings, they will bring comfort in the storms of life. The third verse speaks of charity to others, "prepare a banquet" and welcome everyone, "anointed with oil". The fourth verse reminds us of our heavenly reward for following in the footsteps of the Good Shepherd, Christ.

However, the call to be shepherds will not be easy. The prophet Jerimiah proclaims "Doom" for those who misuse the call. We must be careful in what we do and how we go about the Lord's business. We must be wise, "practising honesty and integrity in the land". We can do nothing fruitful without faith in Our Lord; we must take Him as our Role Model in all we do.

The Ephesians, and all those who have heard the letter from Paul, must have rejoiced at message he gives. He speaks of the unity that was made possible by the sacrifice of Our Lord. Once the Jewish people were separated by a great gulf from the gentiles, the pagan people that lived around and among them. Now, for those who follow Christ, there can be no separation, they are united, as one people, Jews and gentiles, both serving the same God.

We cannot work without rest, and the perfect way to find rest is in the Lord. We need to find a "lonely place" and, through prayer, fill our spirits with the love of God. Again, this is far from easy, when we take up a shepherd's role it is difficult to set it back down again. As the apostles found on the lake, the crowds of unhappy people, needing help, are never far away. Shepherds need a balance in their lives between their needs and those of others.
