Seventeenth Sunday of Ordinary Time



There is a hunger within us that we strive to satisfy; a yearning that calls us to change, to move forward to a better way of living. Paul, in his inspirational letter to the Ephesians, names this hunger; it is a need for worthiness. Life is a world of experiences, it can be good and fulfilling, it can be drab and uninspiring, we can feel let down and useless, unwanted, imprisoned by our way of life or we can feel the joy that comes from God. Paul speaks of being a prisoner but within this imprisonment there is joy and hope, for Paul is a prisoner of the Lord. The call from Paul is for unity; for a people who are united and live selfless, gentle and patient lives. He prays that we do all we can to preserve this unity, to satisfy the hunger within, to become worthy.

Bread is one of the staples of life. There is nothing more dreadful than famine. In biblical times there was no relief from famine. The hunger was constant. There are a number of references to bread in the Old Testament; the manna from heaven, the meal that kept Elijah and the widow and her son alive and today the barley loaves sent to feed the hungry of Elisha's time. These miracles were given to keep the people alive; they were a sign of God's bounteous love for all humanity. The bread in John's Gospel was to satisfy a different hunger.

In John's Gospel Jesus often takes guite ordinary events and transforms them into something extraordinary, something that teaches us, that feeds the hunger of the soul, the spirit, not just the body. As usual he begins with human frailty; Philip sees the problem of the hungry crowd but is at a loss to find a solution, Andrew finds a solution which is quite inadequate, he brings a boy to Jesus and Jesus uses his small offering to teach his disciples and feed the people. Both disciples turn to Jesus in their difficulties; here is a lesson for us when we face difficult situations, no matter how grave we too must bring them to the Lord. Jesus uses the boy and his loaves and fishes, a simple human act of sharing all that is there to feed and sustain. From these small acts a miracle occurs and the crowd of five thousand men with their women and children are satisfied from five loaves and two fishes. John uses this miracle to introduce the idea of Jesus as the Bread of Life but that is for next week. Our communion prayer is "Lord I am not worthy"; the word heals our soul, makes us worthy. **David Frank**
