## **Eighteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time**



Today's readings bring together two passages from scripture and show how the New Testament fulfils the promise of the Old. In the passage from Exodus, we read about the escape of the Israelites from Egypt and their journey through the wilderness; every step of that journey is under the watchful eye of God; a God who guides and protects His people. The community, however, have reached a breaking point in their relationship with God; they are starving and seek to return to their captivity where they will, at least, have food to eat. God, in his compassion, sends manna, bread from heaven, to feed his people and bring them safely through their troubles. Manna becomes the source of life for them until they reach the Promised Land.

In our day we have received, from the hands of Our Saviour, the gift of the Eucharist, the source of our spiritual life. The Israelites received manna from God to sustain them, but we receive something more precious; in the Eucharist we receive the Body and Blood of Christ. This gift, freely given, gives us the strength and the will to become not just followers but brothers and sisters; we become the body of Christ. Paul speaks of a "spiritual revolution" through which we put away the old self and put on a new self; one that has been created in God's way.

In John's gospel the people are searching for Jesus; they have heard him speak, witnessed his healing power, and have been fed in the hills of Israel. They see Jesus as an answer to their prayers for a free and independent state; a king, ruling over a land of plenty where all will be fed. Jesus knows what they want but it is not what he will provide. He wants them to change, to hunger and thirst not for the things of earth but for the things of heaven. The Bread of Heaven is waiting for us in the Eucharist we receive today; a chance, an opportunity, to discover the depth of Christ's love for each of us; we only need to listen to him and believe.
