Nineteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time



Father, I became aware of your presence through the drip, drip, drip of understanding.
Slowly my selfishness was washed away in the stream of your love, changing me from within.
At times that stream dried up and I began to close myself away from you, then, the tide turns, and water began to flow again, and swept me onwards in the flood. I am like a leaf thrown into a stream, sometimes I bob along quietly, then, caught by a twig, I stand stagnant, while life blows by and around me. Then the flood comes again, and I am swept away in your love.

God is always with us. Gradually we come to know Him, within conversion grows, selfishness reduces, we change, and the water begins to flow again. Elijah was caught in that time of life when the water stops flowing and despondency sets in. Just like him, we know not which way to turn. Then, by a miracle of bread and wine, we find the strength to rise again and walk God's way to the destination He has always held out to us.

Paul catches the Holy Spirit of God in a series of simple sentences which spell out the great gift of God's love. He speaks of the freedom of never holding grudges or losing your temper. He urges us to raise not our voices, nor call each other names, to not be spiteful, to be friends, to be kind, forgiving, and loving. In a week when our country has been torn apart by demonstrations and riots, in a week when we mourn the loss of the three little girls of Southport, the need, to hold God's Spirit in our heart and let it teach us how to live, is never more necessary. By our lives we must imitate Christ who sacrificed himself so that we may be called "children of God".

When Jesus tries to explain who He is and why He was sent by the Father he uses the simple language of the peasant families of Israel, He calls himself the Bread of Life. The poor people, for whom He had so much compassion, lived on the edge of famine and they knew that life could still be sustained through a simple meal of bread and water. Their ancestors experienced this in the desert and now, in the desert of their lives, the people are offered again the Bread of Life. Now, in our time, Jesus offers himself through the Sacrifice of the Mass so we too can be fed and be satisfied. David Frank
