

Twenty-First Sunday of Ordinary Time



I am not an artist but, to help with our parish RCIA programme, I once made a sketch to illustrate the journey of the Israelites from Egypt to the promised land. On the sketch I marked the places where significant events had occurred in the journey of the people of God. I marked the Red Sea and the mountains, the deserts, the place where they worshipped the Golden Calf and the mountain of the Ten Commandments. Finally, I marked the Jordan, the last river to cross and the promised land. I then explained that this journey, made so long ago, was also our journey and how we too must walk in the footsteps of the Israelites if we are to find our way to everlasting life.

The pivotable moment on our journey is that final river when Joshua calls on the people to choose between serving the Lord or the false gods of daily life. In our lives we need to leave behind the slavery of Egypt, to live by the commandments of God, and to choose to cross the river and find our home in the arms of our loving saviour.

Paul sees our future in the church that is founded by Christ. He uses the analogy of the love between husband and wife as an illustration of God's love for the church. In the culture of Paul's day there was a great difference between the status of men and women. Men were seen as the head of the household and their wives depended on them to provide food and shelter for them and their children. He calls the church "the body of Christ" and this assures us that the love of Christ will sustain the church because we are his body on earth.

Just as the Israelites made their choice at the river so too the followers of Jesus, after hearing Him speak about the Bread of Life, must choose whether to believe in Him or walk away. Jesus understands that many follow Him because of the miracles and the healing, they do not believe in Him but in what He does. If we are to follow Christ, we must do so through the Spirit that call us to faith. Faith is a gift from God and the Father chooses those he has called to be his children. The Apostles, through Peter, recognise Jesus as the Holy One of God and choose to follow Him. The events of our lives teach us that our faith in God will lead us to Him, He is our choice, we stand with Peter. David Frank


Other News from Around the Diocese
