

When you look at something like the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, and see its 691 pages, or look at the 2,000 pages of the big *Jerusalem Bible*, you can be forgiven for thinking that Christianity is a complicated affair. But Jesus reminds us today that it is essentially very simple: everything can be summed up in two basic rules: love God, love your neighbour. Exodus backs this up, by talking about the simple love that we must show to each other. Not that this is easy - love is always costly, and involves some degree of sacrifice. We will have to change, to become perfect in love; but it is possible, and when we do, like the people of Thessalonica, we become a great example to people everywhere.

Catholic Certificate in Religious Studies

This is a nationally-awarded qualification for those teaching in Catholic schools and required for those who are appointed to senior leadership roles within them. In some cases it is also open to those involved in parish ministries and those wanting to follow it for personal interest (please check with the director about this).

The course consists of eight modules, each requiring ten hours contact time, further reading and an assignment of 1500 words. The whole course is going to be offered in Bolton over the next two years, based at Mount Saint Joseph High School, Farnworth. Four modules will be offered this academic year:

Catholic Education (Tutor: Mr Bernard Stuart) Tuesdays 1, 8, 15 & Wednesday 23 November

Old Testament (Tutor: Rev Paul Daly) Wednesdays 11, 18, 25 & Tuesday 31 January

New Testament (Tutor: Rev Michael Cooke) Mondays 5, 12, 19 & 26 March

Christology (Tutor: Rev Christopher Gorton) Wednesdays 2, 9, 16 & 23 May

Each session runs from 4pm to 6.30pm. There is a one-off registration fee of £35 and then a module fee of £60. The costs might be borne by your school.

This is a good opportunity for Catholic teachers (even if not currently teaching in a Catholic school) or for those who wish to teach in our schools, to gain this award close to home.
